# Indian Institute of Management Lucknow Admission Policy for the PGP, PGP-ABM, & PGP-SM Academic Year 2019-21 (CAT-2018)

Criteria for shortlisting and final selection of PGP, PGP-ABM, & PGP-SM candidates for Batch 2019-21

#### Stage 1: Shortlisting for Writing Ability Test (WAT) – Personal Interview (PI)

Candidates will be shortlisted on the basis of CAT 2018 score, previous academic performance, and other criteria as mentioned below. For PGP-SM, minimum work experience of 24 months is an additional Eligibility Criterion.

### Stage 1 c: Scheduling for WAT-PI

The candidates, who qualify on the criteria mentioned in stages 1 and 2, shall be called for the WAT-PI process. Such candidates shall be required to fill-in and submit the personal data form online. The candidates, who fail to submit their personal data forms within the prescribed time limit, shall not be allowed in the WAT-PI process.

#### Stage 2: Criteria for Final Selection of candidates for PGP/PGP-ABM/PGP-SM programme

A candidate's final score for selection in PGP/PGP-ABM/PGP-SM programme for the batch 2019–21 will be calculated on the basis of the assigned weights as given in Table 4.

- The minimum requirement for getting a pass in Personal Interviews is 12 out of 40 marks. Names of candidates who do not pass in PI will not be included in the final merit list.
